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

Although a temporary separation, the union that was meant to follow never came to fruition, with both parties pursuing different political ideologies. 

## GETTING AROUND

## HISTORICAL VILLAGES

Mirrors into forgotten times, historical villages accurately depict the daily life led by the people of centuries past. Great efforts have been made to preserve these spectacular settlements which enjoy their rightful place as national treasures and UNESCO World Heritage sites. The traditional architecture reflects the strong connection between the people and the land, designed to represent the residing family and the surrounding landscape. Aside from modern reminders such as souvenir shops and restaurants, visiting these villages offers a truly immersive experience.



## SLEEP IN A TRADITIONAL KOREAN HOUSE

Start the day in Hahoe (translated to “village surrounded by water”). Engulfed in the stunning scenery at the foothills of Hwasan Mountain, this 16th-century settlement is a prime example of traditional Korean architecture. After visiting the mask museum and an impressive Confucian school, proceed to Andong where you will spend the night in a traditional Hanok house. Renovated for the convenience and safety of their guests, these houses still retain their historic beauty, offering an authentic cultural experience of Korean life in previous centuries.



## ENJOY NATURE



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## PROBIOTICS


The process of fermentation plays an essential role in traditional food. The art of kimchi making can take anywhere from a few months to a few years, it has become a key technique in many Korean dishes.

# KOREA'S DELICIOUS HOT HITS

There's no doubt that South Korea is a veritable culinary heavyweight whose impact and influence can be felt across the world. Like many countries with long-established cultural origins, gastronomy in Korea is treated like an art form where humble ingredients, wellness ideals, social dynamics, subtle foreign influences, and masterful kitchen skills come together to produce dishes that encapsulate local culture into a delicious and unforgettable nutshell. By now, western foodies are well aware of the spicy fermented goodness of Kimchi — the signature staple food that accompanies almost every Korean meal. But hot on the heels of the continually rising popularity of the country's cultural exports — many of which proudly fly under the K-wave banner — are several dishes with massive crossover appeal that you may want to take note of.



## **BIBIMBAP**

Up on the list with Kimchi as far as definitive Korean meals go, Bibimbap is a well-known rice dish typically topped with sautéed vegetables and beef that's mixed at the table with gochujang (red pepper paste) and soy sauce. Its exact origin is unknown, but its most popular variant is the one that was born in Jeonju — an important South Korean tourist draw that was designated as a UNESCO City of Gastronomy in 2012.

## BULGOGI

Popular amongst western visitors, this traditional dish consists of thin slices of marinated beef sirloin that's cooked over a charcoal barbecue or a stove-top griddle alongside sliced onions, green peppers, and garlic. The marinade can be a blend of soy sauce, sesame oil, garlic, onions, ginger, black pepper, and sugar. The dish is usually served with rice, kimchi, leafy vegetables for wrapping, and a dash of gochujang or ssamjang.

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## SAMGYEOPSAL

This dish has since skyrocketed in popularity in the US thanks to the proliferation of Korean barbecue restaurants across the country. Samgyeop means 'three layers', referring to the layers of fat on pork belly — one of the most favored cuts in Korea. Eating Samgyeopsal is quite a fun social activity where diners sit around a table with its own grill and take turns cooking the pork belly with various items like mushrooms, peppers, onions, and more. Just wrap the grilled slices in lettuce or sesame leaf, dip them in one of several available sauces, and prepare yourself for a delectable burst of savory goodness!

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## JAPCHAE

Once a fixture of Korean royal cuisine back in the days of the Joseon Dynasty, Japchae is now a popular celebratory food item that is often served on special occasions like weddings, holidays, and birthdays. This savory (and slightly sweet) dish is usually prepared by stir-frying dangmyeon — sweet potato glass noodles — with assorted vegetables and meat then seasoning it with soy sauce and sesame oil.

## HISTORY

### **GYEONGBOKGUNG PALACE**

A symbol of the Joseon Dynasty's prosperity, it is the largest of the Five Grand Palaces, built in the heart of 14th-century Seoul, and restored after two Japanese invasions.



### **JOGYESA TEMPLE**

Built in 1395, it stands as the main temple of the Jogye Buddhist Order. It welcomes many visitors drawn by the stunning Daeungjeon Hall and the 500-year-old white pine tree.



### **BUKCHON HANOK VILLAGE**

This incredibly well-preserved historic village is a living work of art, allowing travelers to fully immerse themselves in Korea's bygone times.



### **CHANGDEOKGUNG PALACE**

Translated to "Prospering Virtue Palace", it retains many elements dating from the Three Kingdoms of Korea, gracefully blending in with the natural topography.

# ANDONG

Laid back and surprisingly welcoming, Andong is a destination worth visiting for the myriad historical sites that surround it. Known for its regional specialties, as well as the strong soju liquor, this city offers a glimpse into an authentic Korean lifestyle.

## HAHOE VILLAGE

A worthy UNESCO World Heritage Site, Hahoe Folk Village holds a mystical beauty. This clan-based settlement seems untouched by time and the preservation efforts have been remarkable. Following the Pungsu-jiri (Korean feng shui) guidelines, the village is shaped like a lotus flower.

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## BUYONGDAE CLIFF

Just outside Hahoe, this 200 ft. cliff offers incredible bird's eye views of the village, thus bearing the ancient Chinese name of lotus.


## HAHOE MASK MUSEUM

# JEONJU

A slower paced destination compared to the bustling Seoul or Busan, Jeonju knows how to enjoy the simple pleasures in life. A city with an artistic soul and great nightlife, it stands amongst the favorite destinations for Koreans. A must-see destination for foodies, Jeonju boasts an astonishing culinary scene with great street food, high-end restaurants, and the typical makgeolli (unfiltered rice wine) bars.

Commonly used as a base while exploring the surrounding attractions, Jeonju is easily accessible from all the major cities by train; however, our preferred method of transportation is booking a private car, driver, and guide.

## GYEONGGIJEON SHRINE

The shrine presents the traditional motifs found throughout South Korea. An airy layout following the guidelines of Pungsu-jiri, the roofs are covered by the typical black tiles and the exterior showcases the beautiful contrast between the earthy red and turquoise green colors. This sanctuary commemorates the founder of the Joseon era, King Tae-jo, along with his wife. In the museum, many portraits of successive kings are showcased.



## JEONJU HANOK VILLAGE

With over 800 traditional homes, the Jeonju Hanok Village offers an exceptionally immersive experience. To really encapsulate the bygone era, visitors can enjoy the relaxed atmosphere while strolling through the village wearing a traditional hanbok outfit, indulge in the regional cuisine, and spend a night in one of the historic houses.



# HAEINSA TEMPLE STAY

## HAEINSA TEMPLE

The serene Haeinsa – Temple of the Ocean Mudra – is home to the famous Tripitaka Koreana. Counting exactly 81,352, these wooden printing tablets represent the world’s oldest and most comprehensive Buddhist scripture, with 52 million flawless Chinese characters. Due to impressive efforts, not one tablet has been damaged in over 760 years. Located in the Gayasan National Park, the stunning mountainous scenery complements the peaceful aura that engulfs the temple.

## TEMPLE STAY EXPERIENCE

Enjoy the unique privilege of spending 2 days at the temple. As a cultural experience designed to educate people on Korean Buddhism, it is open for everyone regardless of religious belief.

During this stay, engage in Seon meditations, monastic meals, and a variety of programs that will broaden your understanding of Buddha’s teachings. Above the temple, visit the peaceful hermitages where many famous monks reside.



# GYEONGJU

## YANGDONG VILLAGE

A beautifully preserved village of South Korea, Yangdong is a fine example of traditional Korean architecture and Confucian aesthetics. The picturesque ambiance is best experienced on misty mornings, when the sun starts to illuminate the 4 spines of Mt. Seolchangsansan, and a divine silence reigns over all.

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On the slopes of Mt. Tohamsan, this imposing 6th century temple harbors many national treasures, such as 2 stone pagodas, stunning bridges and, among many other, the bronze Buddha of Enlightenment.

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Part of the Bulguksa Temple, visit this grotto that showcases one of the best Buddhist sculptures in the world, along with stunning sunrise views over the East Sea.

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

Once an exotic garden filled with beautiful flowers and rare animals, Donggung Palace is now home to an exhibition with over 700 priceless historical



## **YOUR BODY, YOUR SEOUL**



As with any respectable port city, word of Busan's vast gastronomical scene has spread far and wide. With a passion for food and the best ingredients that the sea can offer, this city takes great pride in its signature dishes. From crowded street food markets to exquisite high-end restaurants and everything in between, Busan's culinary diversity seems endless. Traditional Korean food combined with the adventurous spirit makes this destination one of the main food hubs in all of Korea.



## THE CITY

Busan is a city of many characters, with each neighborhood uncovering a different trait of its personality. Vibrant and youthful, it lives up to its reputation as a forward-thinking art hub. Busan invites visitors to get lost through the narrow streets of Gamcheon Culture Village and discover the amazing street art hidden amongst the pastel-colored houses. Home to the only United Nations cemetery in the world, here lie 2,300 service members from 11 different countries that fell during the Korean War.

Despite its size, this destination maintains a mellow mood, aside from the lively markets in the morning, and the bustling night life. The cuisine is otherworldly, attractions are many, and the city is undergoing a constant state of modernization. For architecture lovers, the Nurimaru APEC House, a prestigious international building, is a must see.

## THE OUTDOORS

There is just as much to see outside the city as there is inside. Fixed between majestic mountains and the ocean on both sides, Busan's natural allure is truly impressive. Scenic hiking trails, lush parks, and rugged cliffs, all contribute to its beauty.

The Busan Air Cruise offers impressive views of the surrounding area, while crossing over the small gulf that meets Haeundae Beach. With panoramic windows and glass flooring, passengers can soak in the beauty of Busan from one of its main attractions.

On the southern point of Busan, Taejongdae Resort Park is another ideal place to unwind and enjoy the beautiful nature. Scenic, and quiet, it offers astounding views of the ocean and the rugged cliff sides.

## THE KOREAN WAVE

Mirroring the eventual success of homegrown giants such as Samsung, LG, Hyundai, and Kia, the value of South Korea's cultural economy and currency has undergone a steady upward trajectory since the 1990's. Only a few could have predicted back then that South Korea would become the hyphenated pop culture juggernaut that it is today. Augmented by inherent technological savvy, the country has arguably captured the zeitgeist — impacting various cultural spheres including pop music, film, television, cuisine, fashion,



## THE K-POP EXPLOSION

One of the primary exports that fuel the proliferation of South Korean influence on global consciousness is pop music, specifically K-pop. Today it seems like most of the people who have access to the Internet and consume media through massively popular channels like YouTube have been exposed to content that has ties to K-pop and its many generations. From notable innovators like Big Bang and Girl's Generation to the loose K-pop connections of PSY's viral 'Gangnam Style' to the genre-defining output of BTS and BLACKPINK, K-pop has established itself as a cultural tour de force that has broken international barriers while producing hit after infectious hit and selling out stadiums worldwide.

## CINEMA BRAVURA

Although the salad days of film making that ran from the mid-50's to the early 70's is considered as the 'Golden Age of Korean Cinema', the highlights from that time frame were mainly restricted within the country and was immediately followed by a sharp decline in the local film industry. It wasn't until the arrival of trailblazers like Kim Ki-duk, Hong Sang-soo, Park Chan-wook, and Bong Joon-ho did the floodgates completely open for the breathtaking resurgence of Korean movies. Dubbed as 'New Korean Cinema', the late 90's and early 00's saw films like My Sassy Girl become breakthrough international hits and critical darlings like Oldboy win the Grand Prix at the 2004 Cannes Film Festival. History was made when Bong Joon-ho's Parasite bagged the prestigious Palme d'Or at the 2019 Cannes and eventually won four Oscars, including Best Picture and Best Director, at the 92nd Academy Awards in 2020. This momentous and record-breaking run marked a new high for South Korean film making.



## TELEVISION INVASION

For many viewers in Southeast and South Asia, the unprecedented crossover success of 2021's Squid Game and the spellbinding quality of the period zombie extravaganza called Kingdom is not surprising at all. For several decades now, South Korea has consistently produced television shows with a certain panache, technical brilliance, commercial appeal, and glossy quality that's distinctly Korean — many of which transcend local success and become international gems. From landmark K-dramas (Winter Sonata) to historical fare (Dae Jang Geum) to K-zombie thrillers (All of Us Are Dead), South Korean television is a goldmine of compelling entertainment that successfully manages to transcend linguistic barriers and captivate international audiences.


# JEJU ISLAND
